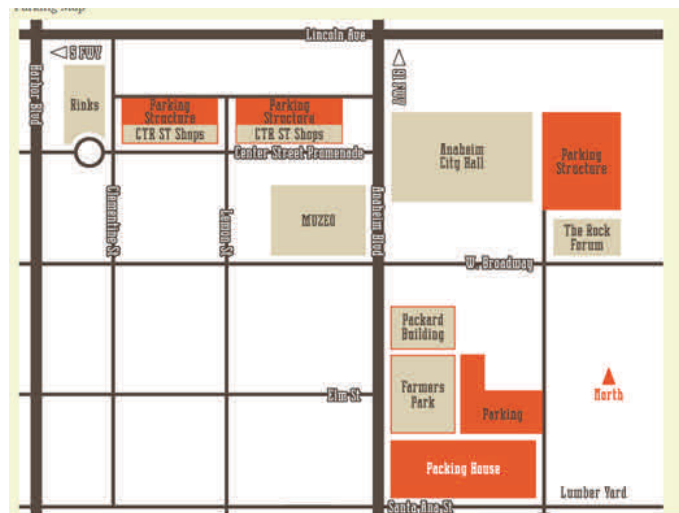

GET THERE:

By car: North on Harbor and East onto Broadway. North onto 42nd Street and park in the structure.

By transit: Take ART bus from hotel to Disneyland Transportation Center on Harbor. Take ART Route #10 to the Packing House or ART Route 18 to Clementine Street/Center Street Promenade

RECOMMENDED: Umami Burger (gourmet burgers), Gypsy Den (organic/veggie faire) Anaheim Brewery (drinks only) The Packing House (variety of eateries)



FULLERTON (DOWNTOWN)

(6 miles from the Disneyland Hotel)

A vibrant culture mixed with an eclectic populace. Always cool, day or night. Specialty restaurants, distinctive shops, entertainment venues, great music and stylish housing. The area is generally bound by Harbor Blvd, Chapman, Whiting, Wilshire, Commonwealth and Santa Fe Avenues. Street Fair on Thursday 4:00-8:30 p.m. on Wilshire Avenue.

GET THERE:

By car: Harbor Blvd North. Park near Chapman Ave. By private transit: Uber ridesharing. www.uber.com (Use this invite link to score a free ride when you sign up for a new account <https://www.uber.com/invite/gaylea2>) By public transportation: OCTA Route #43 runs along Harbor Blvd. connecting the Disneyland Resort area to Fullerton

RECOMMENDED: Shopping for vintage clothing at shops like Kittyshak, Atomic Rag, Geez Louise, Roadkill Enterprises and Out of Vogue

Restaurants: Angelo's and Vinci's Ristorante, Roscoe's Famous Deli, The Cellar, Kentro Greek Kitchen, Tranquil Tea Lounge, El Farolito Jr.,

Bars: Heroe's Bar and Grill, Joe's, Continental Room, Twisted Vine (wine bar).



ORANGE

OLD TOWNE ORANGE (6 miles from the Disneyland Hotel)

Founded in 1871 and centered around Plaza Park with its beautiful fountain where Glassell Street and Chapman Ave meet, this area provides a slice of old town charm in the heart of the City of Orange. Quaint shops, restaurants, antiques and museums. Great walking area with historic homes located on tree-lined streets. Save some time for a visit to the Bowers Museum (2022 North Main Street)

By car: Take Harbor Blvd South to Chapman Ave. Left on Chapman to Glassell

By private transit: Uber ridesharing.

GARDEN GROVE, WESTMINSTER & IRVINE

OC PAN ASIAN DINING- A CULTURAL MELTING POT (5 miles to Garden Grove, 7 miles to Westminster and 15 miles to Irvine)

Did you know that Orange County is home to the third-largest Asian American population in the United States? These three districts are worth a visit for the fabulous dining and shopping adventures:

Korean District of Orange County (Garden Grove) located along Garden Grove Blvd between Brookhurst and Beach Blvd.

By car: South on Harbor Blvd, right on Katella, left on Brookhurst to Garden Grove Blvd. By private transit: Uber ridesharing. www.uber.com (Use this invite link to score a free ride when you sign up for a new account <https://www.uber.com/invite/gaylea2>)

RECOMMENDED: Mo Ran Gak Restaurant, Dae Jang Gum, Hangari Kalogookksu, Kaju Tofu Restaurant and The Past Memories and Paris Baguette can all be found along the 8000-9000 blocks of Garden Grove Blvd.

Little Saigon (Westminster) - The largest concentration of Vietnamese shopping and restaurants in Southern California. The area is bordered by Westminster Blvd, Bolsa Ave. and Magnolia and Euclid Streets.

By car: West on Katella, south on Magnolia to Bolsa

RECOMMENDED: Visit the Asian Garden Mall, T & K

Food Market on Bolsa Ave for a variety of shops and dining venues.

Dining Suggestions: Bo De Tinh Chay, Pho Vie, Pho 79, Quan Hy, Kickin' Crab, Top Baguette, Tan Hoang and Huong Sandwiches. Add desert at Thanh Che Hien Khanh. Le Croissant Dore or Snow Monster.

Diamond Jamboree (Irvine) - A multicultural dining and shopping experience (Voted Best Strip Mall by OC Weekly in 2012). From Curry House CoCo Ichibanya to Chef Hung Noodles you can find it all here. Save room for a treat from Taiwan's famous bakery and coffee house, 85°C Bakery Café. 2700-2750 Alton Parkway, Irvine

By car: I-5 South to Jamboree. Turn right and proceed south to Alton Parkway

Established in 1993, The LAB is Orange County's renowned urban youth "anti-mall", serving the lifestyle demands of the trend setting shopper within a relaxed indoor-outdoor environment. By car: I-5 Fwy South to 55 Fwy South. Exit Baker Street, turn right. Right on Bristol, left into the LAB (2930 Bristol) or right into The Camp (2937 Bristol).

Location: Main Street between Orange & Pacific Coast Highway

Lively street fair held every Tuesday night on Main Street 5-9pm. Come early and make it a day of fun and sun. Miles of bicycle trails along the coast. Bike rental available on the Strand. Surfing lessons. Visit the Surfing Museum and Surfer's Hall of Fame.

By car: I-5 Fwy South to 22 Garden Grove Fwy West. Exit Hwy 39/Beach Blvd South. Turn left, 5 miles to Pacific Coast Highway. Turn right on Main, public parking structure on the 200 block

By private transit: Uber ridesharing . www.uber.com (Use this invite link to score a free ride when you sign up for a new account <https://www.uber.com/invite/gaylea2>)

RECOMMENDED: No Ka Oi (surfer breakfast), Sushi on Fire, Cucina Alessa, Longboards Restaurant and Pub, Huntington Beach Beer Company, Dukes and Sandy's at the pier, Spark Woodfire grill and Zimzala ("free spirited people who find peace with the sand between their toes")



LAKE FOREST

ETNIES SKATEPARK OF LAKE FOREST

Come skate the pools, cradle and the street course at the largest free Skate Park in California. The park boasts a whopping 60,000 + visitors per year as well as numerous competitions. The park is listed as one of the Top 10 Skateparks to skate before you die! Need to buy a board? Stop by Focus Board Shop across the street from the park. Proceed to the park and cross this one off your bucket list.

RECOMMENDED: Visit Oakley World Headquarters (M-F 8am-5pm) located at 1 Icon just to see the inside and shop in their boutique for the latest retail offerings. At days end, grab sandwiches and head to the nearby Baker Ranch Community Park (26380 Rancho Parkway) and enjoy an amazing Orange County sunset, with views from the mountains to the sea.



SAN JUAN CAPISTRANO

ALL ABOARD!!! TAKE THE TRAIN TO SAN JUAN CAPISTRANO (29 miles from the Disneyland Hotel)

Explore the historic Los Rios District, adjacent to the Capistrano Depot, which features more than 40 homes built by European immigrants in the late 1800's and early 1900's. The O'Neil Museum provides an overview of early California development. Kids love Zoomars Petting Zoo, located across the train tracks. Tour the historic Mission San Juan Capistrano and gardens.



By train: Ditch your car and jump aboard Metrolink! Take ART Route 15 to the Anaheim Amtrak/Metrolink station 2150 E. Katella. Amtrak provides service to both historic San Juan Capistrano and the North Beach area of San Clemente



SAN CLEMENTE

(37 miles from the Disneyland Hotel)

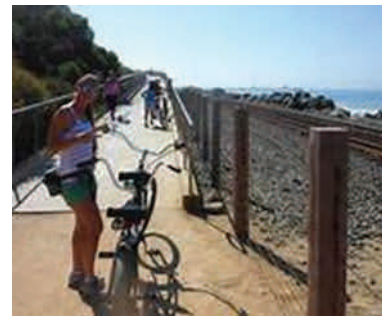

Rent an electric bicycle at the train station and hit the San Clemente Beach Trail. Check out Casa Romantica and the Rainbow Sandals factory and store.

By train: Ditch your car and jump aboard Metrolink! Take ART Route 15 to the Anaheim Amtrak/Metrolink station 2150 E. Katella. Amtrak provides service to both historic San Juan Capistrano and the North Beach area of San Clemente

By car: I-5 South to Avenida Palizada; left on El Camino Real; Right on Avenida Del Mar., on street and public parking available

RECOMMENDED: Pipes Café, LA Galette, Mimosa Café, Hapa J's, Vine Restaurant and Nicks. Time for a picnic? Try Billy's Delicatessen, Tina and Vince's Deli, La Tiendita or Pedro's Tacos for quick food to take to the beach.



NEWPORT BEACH/LAGUNA BEACH

SHOPPING THE GOLD COAST ON A PLANNERS BUDGET

(26 miles from the Disneyland Hotel)

Orange County has no shortage of up-scale shopping opportunities. From South Coast Plaza to Fashion Island (ocean view shopping and a Tesla dealership) to the trendy boutiques in downtown Laguna Beach, one can drop a small fortune. What's a planner to do? Just follow this trail from Newport to Laguna and live the gold coast life on a planner's budget. (AICP credits pending, JK LOL!)

Need a lunch break between Newport and Laguna? Pick up a sandwich at Gary's Deli (3390 Pacific Coast Highway, Newport Beach) and head a few blocks to the south to the bluff top park on Ocean Blvd/Heliotrope. Enjoy the million dollar view and multi-million dollar homes! Or continue south on PCH to the Crystal Cove Shopping Center (7952 Pacific Coast Highway), stopping at the Bear Flag Fish Company (fresh fish tacos and an ocean view for less than \$4!) End the day with a date shake from the Crystal Cove Shake Shack, 7408 Pacific Coast Highway.
