Legislature Returns for Final Push as the End of Session Approaches

After a month-long summer recess, the Legislature returned on August 14 for the final month of the 2023 Legislative Session. In the final weeks of session, the Legislature turns their attention back to the appropriations committees and their respective house for work on each floor. Bills with a fiscal impact above a specified threshold must clear the Senate/Assembly Appropriations Committee's always anticipated Suspense File, where bills can be held and/or made two-year bills without public discussion. While we have seen high-profile bills held on the Suspense File in the past, nearly all high priority bills that APA California is tracking are continuing to move and will now be considered in both houses for final floor votes before being sent to the Governor for his consideration. This session will end on September 14 and all bills that are sent to the Governor in the final days must be acted on by the Governor by October 14. Bills that do not pass this session and are not held on the Suspense File can still be considered next year.

So What Happened to all the Planning-Related Bills?

2023 has been yet another busy year for planning-related legislation and there's a lot to discuss.
