SUBJECT: AB 2934 (Ward) Residential developments: building standards: review – SUPPORT

Dear Assemblymember Ward:

The American Planning Association, California Chapter is pleased to support your AB 2934, which would establish a working group to make recommendations to the California Building Standards Commission on allowing smaller developments, between three and ten units, to be built under the California Residential Code rather than the Building Code. The bill would also require the state to look at standards and other cost pressures from the current building code that are contributing to housing production constraints overall with a goal to reduce them where possible.

APA California is a non-profit organization made up of practicing planners, citizens and public officials committed to advancing the practice of local, regional, and statewide planning throughout urban, suburban, and rural California. As adopted in APA California's Legislative Platform, *Plan California*, our organization is supportive of efforts our that minimize constraints to housing production.

While the Legislature has passed many changes to the housing entitlement and permitting process, we are excited to see interest in looking at other potential constraints to housing development. Reviewing the California Building code to determine areas where changes can be safely made that could address financial constraints to developing smaller multi-family developments could allow these type of projects to pencil out, providing more housing opportunities for communities throughout the state. With construction costs increasing due to interest rates, material costs and labor, in addition to building standards, we believe looking more closely at ways to provide a path for this "missing middle" housing type will serve as an important resource to address the state's severe housing crisis.
